Non-Staff adults in the school - Keeping students safe is our top priority at AWES. To support this, we ask that all non-staff adults visiting our school check in with the main office. Parents, Guardians and visitors are asked to make every

effort to avoid being in the school hallways. Should students arrive late or need to be picked up early, they must transition through the main office. Your support with this is greatly appreciated!

Volunteering - We recognize our responsibility to ensure that all students attending our school are protected by taking reasonable precautions to screen volunteers who may be working with students without direct supervision of staff. In accordance with Nova Scotia's Provincial Volunteer Background Check Policy, prior to volunteering with the Halifax Regional Centre for Education, all volunteers will provide:

A completed Child Abuse Register search, which can be found here. As of June 2025, digital confirmations are available for Child Abuse Register checks. For more information, click here.

A certified and true copy of a Criminal Records Check with Vulnerable Sector Check available here, from your local Police or RCMP detachment or through online organizations endorsed by Nova Scotia law enforcement agencies

Please note: the Child Abuse Register Search and Criminal Records Check must be issued in the three months preceding volunteering and updated every three years. For more information on volunteering, click <u>here</u>.

Orange Shirt Day, led by Indigenous communities, aims to raise awareness about the inter-generational impacts of residential schools and allows us all to show our support for the Every Child Matters movement.

As there are no classes on Monday, September 29 and Tuesday, September 30, we welcome staff and students to wear orange on Friday, September 26.

Nova Scotia's safe school strategy ensures schools have policies, procedures and resources that support our commitment to safe and supportive schools.

Nova Scotia's schools need to be places where students can focus on learning and staff can safely do their jobs.

The Provincial School Code of Conduct Policy supports safe learning spaces. It defines acceptable and unacceptable student behaviours and guides schools in responding to unacceptable behaviours in a consistent and fair way.

Role of Parents and Caregivers

Student success and well-being is best supported when everyone works together. You have a role to play in making sure schools are safe and supportive places to learn:

- speak with your child about appropriate school behaviours
- understand the Code of Conduct and how it applies to your child
- speak to your child's school if you have any questions about the Code of Conduct or safe behaviours
- work with school staff to respond when unacceptable behaviours happen
- model good behaviour

Guiding Principles

- Responsibility: Everyone in the school community has a responsibility to keep schools safe.
- 2 **Equity**: Responses to unacceptable behaviour are fair and consider student's needs and circumstances.
- Restorative and Relationship-Building: Responses to unacceptable behaviours include action to restore positive relationships.
- Clarity and Consistency: There is a shared understanding of what behaviour is acceptable and how unacceptable behaviours will be responded to.

Demographic Form Updates

On September 9, the Demographic Updates Form will be available to families in the PowerSchool Parent Portal. This form should be updated by every family to ensure all information about your child is current, including contacts, medical information, consents and demographics. Even if there are no anticipated changes, please still review this information and submit the form. This information will then be reviewed by the school before updates are finalized. The deadline to submit the form is October 6, 2025.
